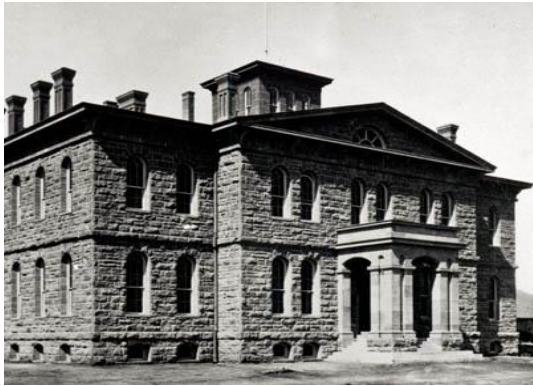

'Judge Clark J. Guild, Museum Founder and Visionary'

Clark J. Guild, Sr. born in Nevada in 1887, spent his boyhood in Dayton, experienced mining and railroading as a young man, attended the University of Nevada, became a lawyer and district attorney of Lyon County and is best known for his long career as a district judge and as the founder of the Nevada State Museum.
